She's worked at several mines over a three year period from 2009 to 2011. She will introduce the geology of the Oil Sands, and then discuss working and living in the unique environment of a mining camp.

Pat Reed, a past AWG-PNW president, is a professional consulting geologist with 25 years experience in engineering and environmental geology. She works for Terra Associates in Kirkland, Washington. In addition to her geoscience background, she has many interests including bronze casting and the research and teaching of early Scandinavian culture.
